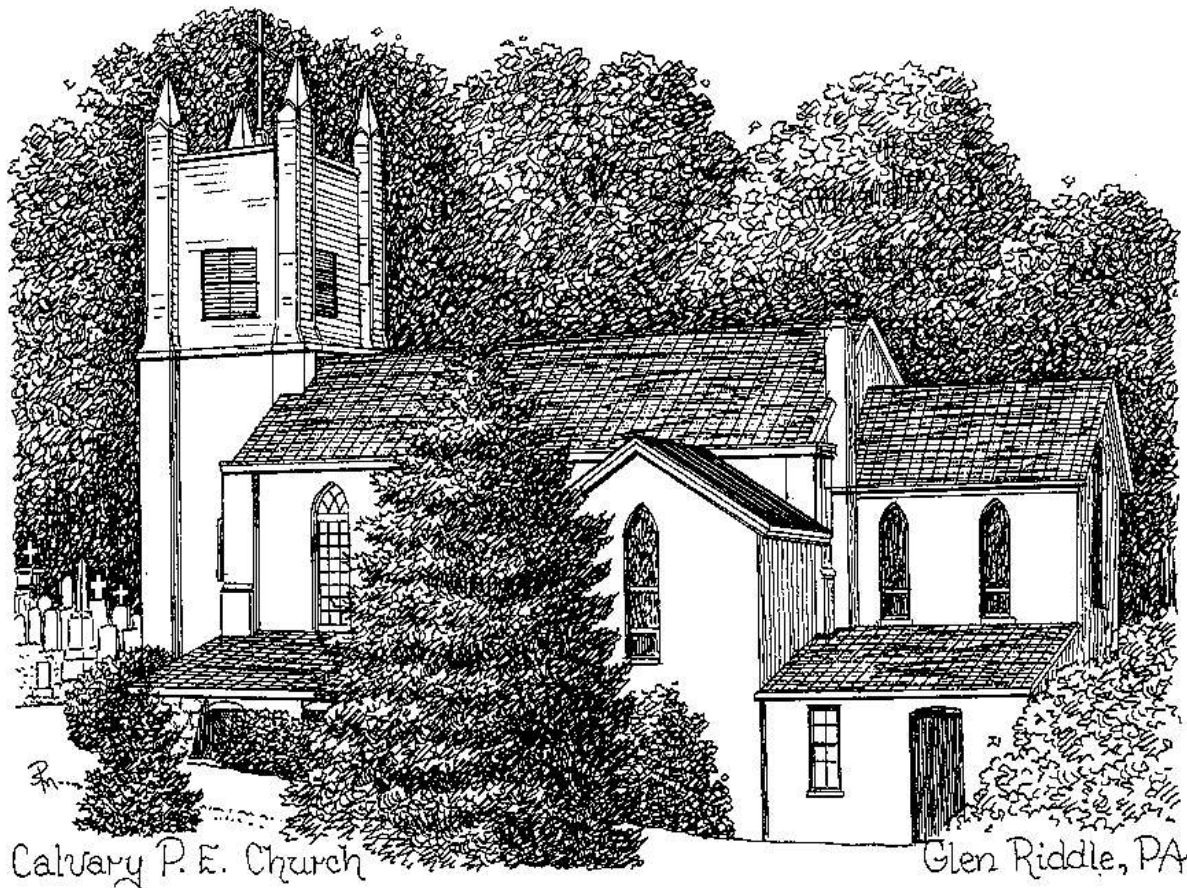

Rector's Report

The Reverend Charles W. Messer, Rector

Grace and Peace to you, from our Lord Jesus, who, by the work of the Holy Spirit, continues to bind us closer together.

It is with thanksgiving to God that I am nearing my third anniversary serving our Lord as your rector. We have much to be grateful for. New families have joined our community. Exciting new ministries have begun. Leadership for ministry has grown. We have been faithful to the mission of Christ through our work together this year: the hungry and thirsty have been feed, the naked clothed, and the sick prayed for and visited.

This year we welcomed Debbie Ney as our organist and choir master. Through her infectious enthusiasm and talent we have a renewed energy in our Sunday morning worship. The choir increased in numbers and

grown in proficiency under her leadership. We look forward to the coming evensong of Lessons and Carols that will kick off our Christmas season.

Our relationship with St James has deepened. Through Lenten suppers and combined worship services we have discovered new friends and fellow Episcopalians to partner in ministry. Our monthly confirmation classes and combined youth group meetings have allowed us to expand our reach of proclaiming the gospel and the potential to grow a thriving program for young people among our two parishes. We are blessed to have found fellow partners in ministry with the congregation of St James and their priest-in-charge, Greg Wilson. We look forward to the future in strengthening our two communities through our ministry together.

We have made a commitment to the spiritual formation of all our members this year. The 10AM worship service was moved to 10:30AM in order for there to be children's chapel and adult Christian education. Beginning with the basics, children's chapel seeks to educate our children in God's love through songs, Bible stories, and prayer. These children are learning things like why and how to cross themselves, why do we bow when the cross processes in, and "hands on" look at how baptism works. Children's Sunday School, led by the amazing talents of Alex Roberts, Allie Brunner and Chelsea Davies. These young ladies engage and bring out the best in our children. I am grateful for the leadership Bonnie Stuffle and Tammy Schwenger as they facilitate our adult forum. Bless you all!

Through numerous ways we have answered the call of those who struggle. We have raised money for hurricane victims in southwest Missouri, helped local families struggling after fire and disaster, and countless families experiencing food insecurity. We provided 25 families Christmas presents through longtime ministry partners, City Team Ministries. As the economy worsened, we saw a dramatic need to make our food pantry a priority. I am grateful for those of you who remember to bring in canned goods each Sunday.

I am most grateful for the many ministers that inhabit our church home. Our vestry has experienced a renewed sense of mission. We have weathered difficulty and conflict and come out on the other side stronger and united. I am most appreciative and grateful for the support, love, and the patience of Job in my Rector's warden, Karen Warren. She has been my advocate, psychologist, confessor, partner, friend and sister these last three years. As she steps down as warden, I am grateful to God to have developed a love and friendship with her. We've come a long way, baby!

Most of all, I give thanks to God for all of you. You have supported Diane, the children and I with love and affection. It is my pleasure to serve God as your rector. Continue to keep our family in your prayers. I also ask your prayers for Calvary, its mission, and your place in it for the coming year.

FINANCIAL WARDEN

The financial report for Calvary Church, Rockdale for the fiscal year 2011 is presented in the following paragraphs.

Our 2011 operating budget is \$186,216 which represents a 0.40% decline from 2010.

Pledge income is the largest single income line and for the pledge total was \$130,356, or 70% of the total. Other major sources of income are Cemetery (7%), Loose Offering/Christmas and Easter (6%), Investment Income (5%), Parking Lot Rent (2%), and St. Elizabeth Guild (1.3%)

From an expense perspective, the largest portion is dedicated to salary and benefits, which account for approximately 57% of the total. All Cemetery expenses represent another 10%. The remaining more significant items include Fuel and Utilities (12.5%), Diocesan Pledge and Assessments (8%), Repairs and Maintenance and Church Supplies (3.9%), Property and Other Insurance (2.5%), and Real Estate Taxes (1%).

Taking a look at where we stand year-to-date, we are operating at a surplus of approximately \$12,000. The principal reason for the surplus is due to a few gifts dedicated for the purchase of equipment for the Cemetery. Excluding these gifts, we are operating fairly close to budget. We still need to complete our assessments to the Diocese for this year, so we remain in our typical tight financial position. Our pledge income is running approximately 2.4% behind budget for the year, while Church Supplies and Snow Removal are above budget.

I know everyone continues to do the best they can to keep current on their pledge. Obviously, without your support we would find it extremely difficult to meet the daily operating needs of Calvary. I thank everyone for their continued support from the financial perspective, and of course from the perspective of gifts of time and talent. We are truly blessed and I value the friendship of everyone at Calvary.

CEMETERY COMMITTEE

Our Sexton has been doing a great job maintaining the cemetery and Glenn Quaile has been working tirelessly to keep our equipment in good running order. This year he and Maggie donated and Glenn rebuilt a tractor. St. James also loaned us a John Deere tractor during the summer cutting season. We also received a generous donation for the purchase of a new tractor. The Vestry has approved the purchase and it should be in place for the 2012 season.

CONVENTION AND DEANERY

Calvary's delegation of Fr. Chuck, Ellen Stone, Andrew Wales, and I attended this year's annual convention at the Convention Center on 11-5-2011. We attended an opening service and Bishop's Address by Bishop Bennison and then set about conducting business throughout the day.

Once again the Camp Wapiti debate dominated our discussions and the following resolution was moved and seconded:

CONCERNING THE SALE OF THE WAPITI PROPERTY

RESOLVED: That the Canons of the Diocese of Pennsylvania be and hereby are amended to add a new Canon 13.5 that reads as follows: “Notwithstanding any other provision of these Canons, (1) The Wapiti Property may be encumbered, unencumbered, sold or otherwise alienated with the joint consent, written or otherwise, of the Standing Committee, the Diocesan Council and the Committee on Finance and Property; (2) the sale, conveyance or mortgage of the Wapiti Property may be undertaken and completed without the consent of the Bishop Diocesan, Charles Bennison; and (3) the proceeds of any such sale or conveyance shall be placed in a temporarily restricted fund and, in accordance with the wishes of Convention and subject to the approval of the Bishop and Standing Committee, shall be used to replenish the funds depleted to purchase and maintain the property (per the Fifth resolve of Resolution R-11 adopted at the 225th Convention of the Diocese of Pennsylvania at its meeting in November of 2008). This Canon 13.5 shall not apply to any Bishop Diocesan other than Charles Bennison, and will become null and void upon the retirement of Bishop Bennison.”

EXPLANATION:

This resolution is presented by representatives of the Standing Committee, Diocesan Council and Finance & Property Committee to provide an opportunity for the people of the Diocese to consider and decide whether to sell or to retain the Wapiti property for the remainder of Bishop Bennison’s tenure.

We believe that it is of vital interest to the health, well-being, and mission of this Church that the laity and clergy elected to the councils of the church be assured that their voices are heard and that your will as expressed through Convention is carried out. To do otherwise runs contrary to the democratic nature of our polity.

In November of 2008, during the 225th Convention of the Diocese of Pennsylvania, the Diocesan Convention approved a resolution that called for the sale of the Wapiti property in Maryland, with the stipulation that the sale receive approval from the Standing Committee, Diocesan Council, and the Finance & Property Committee, in addition to the Ecclesiastical Authority. A Wapiti task force comprised of representatives from Diocesan leadership groups was appointed to select a real estate broker and respond to purchase offers on behalf of the Diocese. The property was duly listed and the Committee has communicated regularly with the governing bodies of the Diocese regarding its activities and decisions since that time.

In February of this year (2011) we received a cash offer of \$6,636,007. This offer reflects the current real estate market (which is not expected to climb in the foreseeable future) and would allow funds currently dedicated to maintaining the property (over \$150,000/year) to be used for ministry in the Diocese. Expenditures will increase significantly by the end of the year when the \$3 million loan from Wilmington

Trust comes due. On behalf of the Diocese, the Finance & Property Committee analyzed the costs and benefits of this offer, carried out due diligence on the buyer, and voted unanimously to accept the offer. After discussing the offer with Bishop Bennison, the Standing Committee voted unanimously to accept the offer.

On March 20, the Diocesan Council voted overwhelmingly to accept the offer – with 24 votes in favor, one vote against and one abstention. Throughout this process Bishop Bennison made it plain that he would not accept the offer to purchase the Wapiti property and that he does not intend to sell the property at all, not even for an offer well above the asking price. Despite the votes of Convention and the elected bodies governing the Diocese to the contrary, the Bishop still intends to run a camp at Wapiti funding it, at least in part, from the sale of closed church properties as well

as from other Diocesan resources as yet unidentified. To this end he removed the property from the market and cancelled the listing agreement with the real estate broker.

While we certainly share the Bishop's commitment to the youth of our Diocese, we are also concerned with ensuring that the decisions made by the Diocesan Convention and the elected governing bodies of the Diocese are carried out. We find it unacceptable that Bishop Bennison would impede the health and mission of this church by imposing his own, sole opinion upon the Diocese. Indeed, we cannot continue to fund the current costs maintaining Wapiti, even now as it lies fallow, let alone invest the additional millions of dollars it would take to re-open and run a camp at Wapiti without abandoning other significant mission activities taking place in our Diocese. We look forward to receiving the report of the Diocesan Mission Planning Commission, to a new and vibrant mission for this Diocese, and to working together in mission.

We lament Bishop Bennison's rejection of the desires and decisions of the Diocesan Convention and his disregard for the counsel of the leadership bodies of this Diocese. We take no pleasure in presenting this resolution; we recognize that it is an unfortunate and extreme step; we take it to address unfortunate and extreme circumstances.

After some lengthy debate, multiple attempts at amending the resolution, and other parliamentary measures, the motion was emphatically approved by a vote of 222 in favor and 149 opposed. At this point, the diocese appears to be moving forward with an action plan to pay off or refinance at least a portion of our outstanding debt on this property and to actually sell it once and for all!
